SHORT BIOGRAPHY

Dimitra Lampropoulou holds a lecturer position of modern and contemporary social history in the Department of History and Archaeology at the University of Athens. She was born in Athens in 1969. She studied history and archaeology and received her MA from the Department of History and Archaeology, University of Athens. In 2008 she completed her PhD dissertation, titled “Metamorphoses of urban landscape and transformations of labour relations: The people who built Athens (1960-1967)” (University of Athens, Supervisor: Prof. Dr Antonis Liakos). Between 2005 and 2008 she worked in the Thematic Group “Work, Gender and Society” of the international research project CLIOHRES (Sixth Framework Network of Excellence CLIOHRES.net) under the coordination of Prof. Dr. Berteke Waaldijk (University of Utrecht) and Prof. Dr. Carla Salvaterra (University of Bologna). From 2012 to 2015 she participated in the research project THALES - University of Crete – “Forms of public sociability in 20th century urban Greece: associations, networks of social intervention and collective subjectivities” co-funded by the European Union and Greek national funds (2012-2015) (coordinator: Efi Avdela, University of Crete). The project brought together historians, political scientists and social anthropologists in Greece and abroad to study aspects of the history of voluntary associations in twentieth-century Greece. Since 2016 she has been a member of the international research project “Memories of the Occupation in Greece” (under the direction of Prof. Dr. Nicolas Apostolopoulos, Freie Universität Berlin-Center für Digitale Systeme, and Prof. Dr. Hagen Fleisher, National and Kapodistrian University of Athens-Department of History), which aims to collect and preserve audiovisual testimonies of different groups of people that survived the German Occupation in Greece and offer an open digital archive for research and educational purposes. In 2017 she worked as a scientific consultant on matters of oral history

research in the research project “Refugees neighbourhoods in the city of Piraeus – From the emergence to the promotion of historical memory”, a cooperation between the National Hellenic Research Foundation and the National Technical University of Athens. Her research interests include labour and gender history, the history of welfare, the history of social movements, history of youth, history of the twentieth century, oral history and the study of memory. Her new book *Μαθητές της νύχτας. Εσπερινή εκπαίδευση, νεανική εργασία και πολιτισμός στη μεταπολεμική Αθήνα* [*Pupils of the Night: Night Education, Youth Work, and Culture in Post-war Athens*] will be published in 2019 by Themelio Publishers. She is a member of the Greek Oral History Association (ΕΠΗ), the Archives of Contemporary Social History (ΑΣΚΙ), the European Labor History Network (ELHN), and of the editorial board of the peer-reviewed journal *Historiein: A Review of the Past and Other Stories*.
